How to infuse your family with the spirit of generosity this Christmas

Around this time each year, many children have made a Christmas wish list that includes items like toys, games, crafts and electronics. While children may express gratitude and joy in response to receiving gifts, the concept of generosity of spirit has certainly changed over the years.

It was St. Nicholas's legendary status of generosity that gave rise to the modern-day tradition of Santa Claus. As the story goes, as a young boy, <u>St. Nicholas</u> was left with a substantial amount of inheritance when his parents died, which he then used to help others—primarily the poor.

St. Nicholas was generous. <u>Generosity</u> is defined as the quality of being kind and giving time, attention or gifts to others without conditions or the expectation of getting something in return. Being generous is seen as a positive virtue in people and has been linked with other emotions such as <u>empathy</u> and compassion.

Parental behavior matters

The roots of generosity, such as empathy, compassion and prosocial behavior, begin to develop in the toddler years.

One study of charitable giving by children shows that boys and girls give equally. Research also shows that by the age of nine most children have a good understanding of generosity. As with all as-

pects of development, as the child ages, greater understanding and mastery of generosity will unfold.

What role do parents play in socializing children to be more generous? One way is by showing generosity themselves. Research shows that a parent's level of generosity and charitable behavior is correlated with their child's display of the same behaviors.

Modelling generosity makes an impression on children and is thus a great first step to fostering this behavior. <u>Siblings can also effectively role model empathy and compassion</u>, which also leads to generosity.

Another way is to talk with children about generosity. Studies have shown that having family discussions about generosity had a stronger influence on children's charitable behavior than parent role modelling alone.

Five ways to help foster generosity

Give experiences. Gift gifting does not always need to come in the form of material possessions. Giving experiences can be of value as well. This can include time with caregivers, such as a set of tickets that children can "turn in" to bake together, do arts and crafts, go skating, swimming, hiking, or to a movie or the theatre. These experiences are also opportunities to discuss the value of family connection and making memories.

Give to those in need. Discuss the legend of Saint Nicholas (Santa Claus) and his spirit of giving to those who are less fortunate. Encourage children to add a gift to someone in need to their Christmas or birthday wish list, or to give used or unused material possessions (such as toys, books or clothing) to those without.

Give without expecting anything in return. The core concept of generosity is to give without conditions. Show children that being charitable is unconditional. Several reputable local, national and international organizations have charitable gift giving programs for children in need (for example, providing water purification tablets and school supplies). Give the gift of time. Together with your children, come up with a list of ways they could give their time to someone else. This could be shoveling someone's driveway, weeding a neighbor's garden, or cleaning up his or her local park. They could also give their time to an organization in need of volunteers (for example a soup kitchen).

Give year round. Generosity and kindness shouldn't just happen over the holidays. Make these concepts part of your everyday family life and try to schedule acts of kindness together. At the dinner table, ask your children: "Can you tell me a time today you showed kindness?" You can also talk about how, as a parent, you showed kindness or generosity to someone in your professional or personal life that day.

Giving gifts is certainly part of being generous, but as we all know, the holidays can also be a time of stress and panic about getting the right gift, navigating the shopping mania in stores, and frankly, just paying for everything. All is not lost, however, there are other narratives that parents can use around kids when it comes to generosity like the story of the birth of our Lord and the generosity found in it.

Take time this year to share with your children why Jesus was brought into our world and what gifts he gives to all of us through his life, death and resurrection. May you and your family be blessed with a FULL CHRISTMAS and may the generosity of our Lord touch you in a very special way this Holiday Season...

How Did the "12 Days of Christmas" Come to Life?

The story goes that from 1558 until 1829 people in England were not allowed to practice their faith openly.

During this era, the song 'The Twelve Days of Christmas' was written as a subtle way of celebrating Christ's birth in public without risk of prosecution.

The song's lyrics had a hidden meaning known only to members of the church. Each element of this song offered "code meanings" about Christmas that brought the story of Christ's birth alive for people of faith.

- 1. The partridge in a pear tree stood for *Jesus Christ*
- 2. The two turtle doves stood for the *Old and New Testaments*
- 3. Three French hens stood for faith, hope, and charity.
- 4. The four calling birds were the *four gospels*
- 5. The five gold rings represented the *first five books of the Old Testament* (the Law).
- 6. The six geese a-laying stood for the six days of creation
- 7. Seven swans a-swimming signified the sevenfold gifts of the Spirit.
- 8. The eight maids a-milking represented the Beatitudes.
- 9. The Nine ladies dancing were the nine fruits of the Spirit (see the fifth chapter of Galatians).
- 10. Ten lords a-leaping were the *Ten Commandments*.
- 11. Eleven pipers piping stood for the eleven faithful disciples.
- 12. Twelve drummers drumming symbolized the twelve points of belief in the Apostles Creed.

Isn't that fascinating? Whether or not the story is based on true occurrence, hearing this story gives each of us pause to reflect on the song. Each element of the lyrics offers a positive reason to celebrate our faith in Christ. With the deeper meaning to contemplate, the song becomes a lighthearted anthem of praise and a tribute to those who dared celebrate, in song, their gratitude for Christ.

Aren't we blessed to be able to worship the Savior without fear of harm? Maybe we should stand a little taller

and be more open in sharing the gospel with those who don't yet have the truth. Aren't we blessed to have the scriptures to read and ponder? Maybe we should spend a bit more time reading those words that are openly available to us. Don't we have more to learn and practice so that we truly understand faith, hope, and love?

Would it not be good to become better acquainted with the fruits of the Spirit, and be a better example of them? There are only a few days before Christmas arrives this year, so take time to listen to the song "The Twelve Days of Christmas" a few times and celebrate the blessings of being able to openly and wholeheartedly celebrate the birth of God's SON, and your faith in him!
