The Emotions of Easter

The Gospel stories of the resurrection of Jesus—known as the Resurrection Narratives—are rich and diverse, describing various encounters with the risen Christ and offering us many wonderful images to ponder and pray about.

One reason I love these stories is because they help us understand that Easter is not a one-dimensional, one-size-fits-all experience of joy and enthusiasm. Rather, encounters with the risen Christ result in all kinds of human emotions, from disbelief and amazement to fear and trembling! And let's not forget those feelings of confusion, and even doubt.

The earliest of the four Gospels, the Gospel of Mark, has the shortest Resurrection Narrative and ends quite abruptly. In Mark's account (16:1-8), three women approached the tomb of Jesus, intending to anoint his body. Upon discovering the empty tomb and being told by a young man that Jesus had been raised, they were "seized with trembling and bewilderment," and "they were afraid." They fled from the tomb! Certainly joy came to these women later. But it was not their first response.

In Luke's Gospel, a group of disciples encountered a stranger on the road (24:13-35). Of course the stranger was the Risen Christ, but they did not recognize him at first. He walked with them and talked with them. When they ate together—when he broke the bread and gave it to them—they recognized him. But he immediately vanished! The moment of full presence—the moment of understanding what was happening and recognizing who they were with—was painfully fleeting.

And, of course, who could forget Thomas, whose story we read in John's Gospel (20:24-29)? When he heard that Jesus was raised, Thomas declared that he would not believe unless certain conditions were met. He wanted to see for himself. He wanted to touch the risen Christ! Who doesn't sympathize with our friend, Doubting Thomas? We've all felt the ground shift beneath our feet. **Uncertainty is part of life.**

And finally, a strange but realistic note is sounded in the Gospel of Matthew, when the disciples approached the Risen Christ on a mountain in Galilee (28:16-20). The text says that when they saw Jesus, "they worshiped, but they doubted."

Worship and doubt seem like opposites, and yet here they are, coexisting in the minds, hearts, and even the bodies of those who are closest to Jesus.

Whatever mixed emotions you may be feeling as this Easter's season approaches, remember they are all natural and authentic.

As the Gospel stories remind us, you are simply an honest participant in a long tradition of being human—of encountering the divine, the mystical, the hard-to-believe, and the profoundly beautiful—in the midst of your "regular life."

However, in the end, even in the core of our worries, doubts, and fears, there is a deep-seated, quiet joy in our hearts that can never be taken away.

Why is that? Because after Jesus' life and death we received that most important message we could ever receive..."The Lord is risen, he has risen indeed!"



Why Does Easter Change Dates?

With the annual change from April to March and back again, it's not always easy to keep track of the <u>Easter</u> date. Unlike Christmas and Valentine's Day, the date of Easter changes every year. It can be as early as March

22 or as late as April 25. It comes early this year, falling on the last Sunday of the month, March 31. This is 10 days earlier than last year's April 9 date. Next year, Easter is back to the month of April, falling much later than the past two years on April 20, 2025. Of course, this also means that the <u>beginning of Lent</u> and <u>Ash Wednesday</u> change dates every year, too.

You may find yourself wondering why exactly the date of Easter changes annually like Thanksgiving Day, instead of being set in stone like other holidays. After all, the Fourth of July is always on July 4, and Halloween always comes on October 31, too. Most Christians know Ash Wednesday's date depends on Easter, but wouldn't it be much simpler (and easier to remember) if Jesus Christ's resurrection were celebrated on a set day, the way other holidays like Christmas and Valentine's Day are observed? But it's not, and here's a look at why that's the case.



Ash Wednesday 2024

Ash Wednesday signals the 40-day period leading up to Easter, called Lent, when observants typically "give up" some earthly pleasure (wine, chocolate, sugar) as a form of penance. But what does Ash Wednesday mean? The holiday stems from the Old Testament book of Daniel that associated fasting with ashes, according to priest and Duke Divinity School assistant professor Lauren F. Winner. Its main ritual involves a priest invoking Genesis 3:19 ("...for you are dust, and to dust you shall return.") while anointing congregants' foreheads with ashes from Palm Sunday—itself derived from the story of Christ's route to Jerusalem being padded by palm fronds—and sometimes oil. Lent is an acknowledgment of the 40 days the Bible says Christ spent in the wilderness.

Because Ash Wednesday kicks off the Lenten season, its date is always exactly 46 days before Easter (40 days of Lent, plus six, as each Sunday is skipped) and thus is affected directly by what date Easter falls on that year. This year, Ash Wednesday fell on Wednesday, February 14.

Which brings us to our central question: Why is Easter on a different date each year? And why is it on March 31, 2024, this year, which is earlier than last year and the year before? The holiday, which celebrates Christ's resurrection from the grave following his crucifixion, can occur any Sunday between March 22 and April 25. (That's a pretty wide range!)

Easter's exact date varies so much because it actually depends on the moon. The holiday is set to coincide with the first Sunday after the Paschal Full Moon, the first full moon after the vernal equinox--that moment in the spring when the <u>Sun</u> is exactly above the <u>Equator</u> and day and night are of equal length. This happens about March 21 or 22. Though the equinox's exact date can vary each year according to the <u>Old Farmer's Almanac</u>, the church always recognizes the vernal equinox as March 21.

So why does Easter come after the Paschal Full Moon? Early Christians wanted Easter to coincide with Passover, because Christ's death and resurrection happened right after the Jewish holiday. Because the Jewish calendar is tied to solar and lunar cycles, the dates of Passover and Easter fluctuate each year.

So to keep it simple...Easter is the first Sunday after the full Moon that occurs on or after the spring equinox. If the full Moon falls on a Sunday then Easter is the following Sunday.

^{*}Ash Wednesday is exactly **46 days before Easter Sunday**, a moveable feast based on the cycles of the moon. The earliest date Ash Wednesday can occur is 4 February (which is only possible during a common year with Easter Sunday on 22 March), which happened in 1598, 1693, 1761, and 1818 and will next occur in 2285.
